Grace Loucks Elliott donated the remaining papers, including her own notes following her husband's death, in 1951. In 2011 Elliott's daughter Jean Johnson donated Elliott's photographic collection to The Burke Library Archives.

Biography

Harrison "Sunny" Sacket Elliott was born in St. Clairsville, Ohio, on December 13, 1882. He held degrees from Ohio Wesleyan University (A.B. 1905), Drew Theological Seminary (B.D. 1911), Teacher's College, Columbia (A.M. 1922), and Yale University (Ph.D. 1940). In 1927, he married Grace Hunsberger Loucks in 1927, and they raised three children together. Elliott and Loucks worked in similar fields, and they often collaborated.

After graduating from Wesleyan, Elliott served as secretary to Methodist Bishop James W. Bashford in China. During this time, he lived for two periods in China (May 1905-April 1906 and January 1907- May 1908). On his way to the first tour, he passed through Honolulu and Japan. On his way to the second trip, he travelled through Europe (England, France, and Italy) and India, and subsequently returning by the Trans-Siberian railway.

While in China, 1906-1908, Elliott wrote for the Associated Press as correspondent, and sent articles for publication in the Epworth *Herald* and the Ohio Wesleyan *Transcript*. Upon his return to the US, Elliott became Secretary for the International Committee of the Y.M.C.A. in their student publication and religion departments and also worked with the Association Press (the YMCA's publishing branch). During World War I, he was involved in Y.M.C.A. National War Work and then as teacher in the Y.M.C.A.'s National Training School.

After a brief spell as instructor in religious psychology at Drew (1921-1923), Elliott joined the UTS faculty in 1922 to teach religious education. In 1925, he became Skinner and McAlpin Professor of Practical Theology and head of the Department of Religious Education and Psychology. As a faculty member at UTS, he often taught in Teacher's College as well, particularly in joint summer programs.

Elliot retired from Union Theological seminary in 1950 as Professor Emeritus and died in Rhinebeck, New York, June 27, 1951.

Collection Scope and Content Note

This collection is comprised of H.S. Elliott's papers from his brief career as a missionary, as well as an extensive collection of photographs from the same, papers and publications from his lifelong engagement with the YMCA, and his academic and professional papers, including course notes, publication drafts and reviews, and student papers. Also included is a rather substantial collection of correspondence from various parts of his career, and a number of things added after his death by his wife (Grace Loucks) and his daughter (Jean Johnson), the latter of whom made extensive use of her father's photographs in her own career as an educator in world history. The papers are significant for the history of American Christianity on several counts. First, Elliot's photos document both his part in mission work in China and (more explicitly) many facets of daily life in the country around the beginning of the 20th century (see especially Subseries 9A). Second, Elliott's longtime involvement with the YMCA in many different capacities is amply demonstrated by his papers here (Series 3). Third, Elliott is well known for his academically for his exploration of the relationships between theological education and psychology, which he pursued in both his coursework (see subseries 6A) and his publications (series 4).

Note: When originally processed, box and folder numbers for the first eight series were applied sequentially (i.e., boxes 1-23, without regard for series). The ninth series, which was only partially processed before 2017, is numbered, according to updated standards, by subseries (i.e., 9A, boxes 1-6; 9B, boxes 1-3).

The collection is organized in 9 series, with 6 subseries:

- **Series 1: Missionary in China, 1905-1908 (.5 box, .25 lin. ft.)**

This series contains letters recounting Elliott's travels to his family. Unless addressed to a specific recipient, all of them are written to "Dear Ones at Home." Specific recipients include his mother; father; brothers, Albert and Calvin; and Bishop and Mrs. Bashford. The final folder contains correspondence typed by Elliot, some of which may be on behalf of Bishop Bashford. The letters are followed by Elliott's Reports from China as Secretary to Bishop James W. Bashford from 1905-1908. All are typewritten and fragile.

- **Series 2: Personal Files, 1905-1951 (.5 box, .25 lin. ft.)**
This section includes notes on Elliott's appointment to and retirement from Union Theological Seminary; correspondence concerning his Columbia doctoral dissertation; memorabilia; and a memorial article about Elliott.
- **Series 3 YMCA, 1912-1943 (3 boxes, 1.5 lin. ft.)**
This series is comprised of surveys, reports, Army work during the First World War, materials from conferences and summer schools, and materials for a postgraduate course for YMCA secretaries operated jointly by Columbia University and Union Theological Seminary.
- **Series 4: Published and Unpublished Writings, 1914-1951 (3 boxes, 1.25 lin. ft.)**
This series is made up of Elliott's publications and academic writings. Included are books, pamphlets, articles, addresses, chapel talks, as well as manuscript notes, unfinished articles, course notes, drafts, and reviews of his publications.
- **Series 5: UTS: Administrative and Other Papers, 1922-[1943?] (1.5 boxes, .5 ft.)**
This series includes departmental reports, information relating to the School of Religion with pamphlets from S. L. Mershon, conference materials, notes and memoranda.
- **Series 6: UTS Course Materials, [1918?] - 1950 (5.5 boxes, 2.75 lin. ft.)**
Included in this series are the materials from the courses Elliott taught at UTS, primarily from his various Religious Education courses. They are organized in two subseries.
 - **Subseries 6A: Class Notes, 1923-1950 (3.5 boxes, 1.75 lin. ft.)**
This series includes notes for Elliott's courses at UTS, prepared lectures, drafts, related papers, and enclosures. The folders are ordered by Course Number.
 - **Subseries 6B: Articles and pamphlets, [1918? -1947?] (2 boxes, 1 lin. ft.)**
These items are arranged by type of material: articles, pamphlets, books, then alphabetically by author. Some materials have been transferred to oversize folders and box.
- **Series 7: Extracurricular Activities, 1920-1950 (3 boxes, 1.25 lin. ft.)**
This series is comprised of papers from Elliott's various other commitments while he was at UTS. These include conferences, committees, extracurricular engagements, and other involvements, such as the Religious Education Association.
- **Series 8: Correspondence, 1933-1950 (5 boxes, 2 lin. ft.)**
In this series, Elliott's general correspondence is arranged by correspondent's name in alphabetical order, followed by letters left unsorted. In this series it will be found that Elliott's correspondence contains carbons and many enclosures. Oversized material transferred from other boxes, including both from his correspondence and from earlier series, is placed in box 23 of series 8.
- **Series 9: Elliott's Photographs, 1905-2007 (23 boxes [18 oversize], 8.25 lin. ft.)**

This series includes a large collection of photographs from Elliott's travels around the world as a young man. In particular it is composed of a long series of negatives (and many prints) taken during the course of his two extended trips to China as the secretary of Bishop Bashford. The bulk of the collection is a series arranged by Elliott, which includes numbered envelopes with handwritten notes by Elliott, as well as (almost always) a negative and (often) prints. Also included are series of prints and postcards made from his photos, as well as a number of files including Jean Johnson's use of the photos in her teaching material. The collection is organized here into four subseries.

- **Subseries 9A: Main Photo Collection (6 oversize boxes, 6 lin. ft.)**
This subseries represents the bulk of the photographic material included in the collection. Elliott organized them into a long series, numbered from 18200-19557. This seems to have been Elliott's archive of negatives, kept in numbered brown paper envelopes with identifying information. Some also include a print. Most of the series is intact, but some envelopes and negatives are missing. If either the envelope or the negative is present, they are listed below in the contents; if neither is present, the number is not listed. Photos in the series numbered from 19481 to 19557 are all labelled "Bashford 1909." These photos may have been taken by someone else and given to Elliott later, because he was not in China with Bashford after 1908.
- **Subseries 9B: Albums, Postcards, and Other Prints (3 boxes, 1.25 lin. ft.)**
Included in this subseries is a collection of prints of Elliott's photos, representing five rough groups. First, there are two photo albums, one focusing on a trip on the Yangtze River in 1907-1908, and one containing a more general run of photos from his time in China. Both contain white pencil descriptions in Elliott's hand. Second, there is a collection of postcards, many apparently made from negatives in subseries 9A. Most of these are undated, except one which has a note from Elliott dated 1908. Third, there is a numbered group of prints (called here the "Elliott Group") apparently made by Elliott, judging by the notes on the back of many. Fourth, there is a mixed collection of prints, undated save for one from 2007, included among a number of files of materials made by Jean Johnson, Elliott's daughter, in the course of her teaching career. It seems she used her father's photos quite frequently in her world history courses. These prints have been cross-referenced with the negatives in subseries 9A where possible, but some of them seem to represent prints of negatives absent from the main series.
- **Subseries 9C: Mounted photos (2 boxes, 1 lin. ft.)**
This subseries contains 85 prints mounted on black cardboard by Elliott. Many have handwritten descriptions by him, either on the back (in pen) or the front (in white pencil). Some of the descriptions are very faded and difficult to make out, but many are still clear. These prints have also been cross-referenced with the negatives in subseries 9A where possible, but some of them seem to represent prints of negatives absent from the main series.

- **Subseries 9D: Framed photos (12 oversize boxes, 15.5 lin. ft.)**
This last subseries includes a large collection of undated framed prints Elliott's photos made by Jean Johnson. In all but a few cases, they have been cross-referenced with the main series. Most of them have been left in their frames, and they are organized roughly by print size.

Processing

Metal clips and staples were removed from materials and folded items were flattened. Materials were placed in acid-free folders and boxes. Acidic items were separated from one another by interleaving with acid-free paper as needed. Any items in an advanced state of deterioration were placed in Mylar envelopes.
